TITLE OF COURSE

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING - Abbreviated as B.Sc. Nursing

AIMS

The aims of the undergraduate BSc. Nursing program are to;

- 1. Produce knowledgeable competent nurses and midwives with clear critical thinking skills who are caring, motivated, assertive and well-disciplined responding to the changing needs of profession, healthcare delivery system and society.
- 2. Prepare them to assume responsibilities as professional, competent nurses and midwives in providing promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative healthcare services in any healthcare setting.
- Prepare nurses and midwives who can make independent decisions in nursing situations within the scope of practice, protect the rights of individuals and groups and conduct research in the areas of nursing practice and apply evidence- based practice.
- 4. Prepare them to assume role of practitioner, teacher, supervisor and manager in all healthcare settings.

OBJECTIVES

On completion of the B.Sc. Nursing program, the Nursing graduates will be able to;

- 1. Utilize critical thinking to synthesize knowledge derived from physical, biological, behavioral sciences, and humanities, in the practice of professional nursing and midwifery.
- 2. Practice professional nursing and midwifery competently and safely in diverse settings, utilizing caring, critical thinking and therapeutic nursing interventions with individuals, families, populations and communities at any developmental stage and with varied lived health experiences.
- 3. Provide promotive, preventive and restorative health services in line with national health policies and programs.
- 4. Integrate professional caring into practice decisions that encompass values, ethical, and moral and legal aspects of nursing.
- 5. Respect the dignity, worth, and uniqueness of self and others.
- 6. Apply concepts of leadership, autonomy and management to the practice of nursing and midwifery to enhance quality and safety in health care.
- 7. Utilize the latest knowledge and skills related to information and technology to enhance patient outcomes.
- 8. Communicate effectively with patients, peers, and all health care providers.

- 9. Utilize the requisite knowledge, skills and technologies to practice independently and collaboratively with all health professionals applying the principles of safety and quality improvement.
- 10. Integrate research findings and nursing theory in decision making in evidence-based practice.
- 11. Accept responsibility and accountability for the effectiveness of one's own nursing and midwifery practice and professional growth as a learner, clinician and leader.
- 12. Participate in the advancement of the profession to improve health care for the betterment of the global society.

REGULATIONS

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

Eligibility to Appear for Examinations

A candidate must have a minimum of 80% attendance in theory and practical in each course / subject for appearing for University Examination. A minimum of 80% attendance in all the non-exam going subjects in the concerned semester also is essential for registering a candidate for the university examination.

Condonation of Shortage Attendance

- The condonation of shortage of attendance of a candidate to a **Maximum of 10%**, for subject/ subjects (in theory or in practical or both) can be granted once only, during the entire course period.
- The Principal/Head of the Institutions are empowered to grant condonation for shortage of attendance on recommendation by the HOD/ under intimation to KUHS on genuine grounds only. In such cases the Principal shall submit a declaration that the particular candidate has not enjoyed this facility previously in the particular course.
- There shall be a register for recording the Condonation availed in the office of Principal. However, a candidate must have to complete 80% of attendance in each of the theory and 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of Degree.
- A candidate must have to complete 80% of attendance in each of the theory and 100% attendance in each of the practical are as before award of Degree.
- The candidate must secure 50% marks for internal assessment in theory and practical, wherever is applicable in order to be eligible to appear in the university examination of the subject. Minimum pass mark shall be 40% for Communicative English and Elective modules.

- The candidate shall appear for University examinations at the end of each semester:
 - i. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous University examinations before appearing for University examinations at the end of fifth semester and before appearing for University examinations at the end of Seventh semester. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
 - ii. The candidate should clear all the previous examinations before appearing for final Semester/ (Eighth Semester) examination.
 - iii. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8years.
- The Principal / Head of the institution shall submit Attendance Certificate of eligible candidates at the time of registration for examinations in each semester.

Schedule of Regular/Supplementary Examination

- Examinations shall be conducted as per the schedule approved by the Board of Examinations. Regular University examinations will be conducted at the end of each Semester.
- Supplementary examinations shall be conducted along with the End Semester University examinations. However, for ensuring the supplementary chances for failed students, University examinations of different subjects shall not be scheduled on the same date.
- A student who failed in a subject/ subjects may be permitted to reappear in the subsequent end semester university examination.

Scheme of Examination showing maximum and minimum marks.

- Candidate who has secured a minimum of 50% marks in theory (for internal and university examination separately) and 50% marks in practical (for internal and university examination separately) in a subject, shall be declared to have passed in that subject.
- Candidate who has secured a minimum of 50% marks in aggregate in a Subject/paper having more than one section shall be declared to have passed in all the concerned Sections of that subject/paper.
- A minimum of 40% marks shall be the pass mark in Internal / College examination for Communicative English and Elective modules.
- A candidate failing in either theory or practical of a subject has to reappear for both theory and practical of that subject.
- A candidate who passed all the subjects (including theory and Practical) from Semester I to semester VIII and completed 80% of attendance in theory and 100%

of Attendance in practical in each subject shall be declared to have passed the BSc Nursing Course.

Internal Examination

- The students are expected to maintain high academic and clinical standards of performance throughout the programme.
- Regular tests/ formative assessments will be made and recorded.
- During each semester two session exams and model examination will be conducted
- Statement of internal marks is made on the basis of marks obtained from session examinations and assignments.
- The student should strictly appear for the internal tests as scheduled. .
- Parent teachers meeting will be conducted ordinarily two times in a semester. A
 progress report is maintained in the college duly signed by parent/guardian and
 student.
- A record of clinical evaluation is made to assess the level of performance of the students in the practical internal assessment.
- A cumulative record is maintained for each student.

Clinical Practice / OSCE/ OSPE and Record of practical work

- Simulation Based learning is a vital part of the clinical practice. A maximum of 13% of clinical hours can be used in simulation lab / skill lab.
- The students will be sent for practice to the parent Hospital and affiliated hospitals as scheduled.
- A record of practical work is maintained to record whether or not she has performed the procedures to the satisfaction of clinical supervisors.
- All procedures should be signed on time as per the instructions. The procedures should be signed by the faculty or authorized staff when the student has done it satisfactorily.
- The record is evaluated at the time of University Practical examination and any malpractices in procedure record like forgery, change of procedure book will be severely punished.

Absence and Leave

- Students are allowed to avail leave on medical ground with prior information. On return they should submit a medical certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner stating full particulars of their illness and treatment.
- In case a student absents herself/himself from duty/class for any reason she/he should inform the class coordinator in the beginning of the day. If the Principal/class coordinator is not satisfied with the explanation regarding her/his absence, the student will be asked to compensate for the number of days she/he was absent at the rate of three days for a day of absence.

- Unauthorized absence from the regular classes/clinical/class test/session examination will be viewed seriously.
- The attendance will be monitored and will be sent to the University every month.

Vacation

- Vacation is planned as prescribed. However the number of vacation will be shortened based on the academic requirements.
- If the student is unable to return in time for any reason, the parent should inform the authority. However the additional leave will result in compensation.

General Discipline:

- The student is directly under the disciplinary control of the Principal and should abide by the rules and regulations of the Institution.
- The students should always maintain the standard and decorum of the College through their professional/academic excellence and discipline.
- A SSGP unit is functioning in the College as directed by the University. The advanced and slow learners will be identified and appropriate action plan will be executed.
- Every student is expected to be courteous in talk and behavior at all times .They must use polite expressions like "Thank You", "Excuse Me", "Sorry", "Please" as and when necessary.
- Students must be regular and punctual for lectures, demonstrations, seminars, practical, field work and such other academic exercises. They are required to attend all the allotted working periods in each of the prescribed subjects.
- Every student shall have with him / her text books and note books required for the classes.
- All assignments shall be regularly completed and submitted as directed by the teacher. The assignments are to be hand written.
- Inattentiveness, indifference towards any subjects, antisocial acts towards any member of the staff and colleagues or any act which affect the discipline of the college will be viewed seriously.
- The students shall not indulge in any form of activity, which will bring disrepute to the Institution / and profession.
- The students are not permitted to enter the faculty room/ office without permission of the concerned faculty/staff.
- The students should get permission from the class coordinator to visit relatives in the hospital wards.
- The students should maintain gentle and healthy relationship with classmates and staff of the College.
- The students should maintain a healthy and therapeutic relation with the patients and relatives.
- The students should maintain strict discipline inside the college bus.

- The students should not engage in indisciplinary activities like teasing, using abusive language, verbal threat, intimidation etc to colleagues and staff.
- In the absence of a teacher, the class representative assumes the responsibility for order and discipline of the class.
- The students shall keep the classroom, common room, labs and toilets, which they are using, neat and tidy. Waste paper basket may be used to put waste materials and waste paper.
- Use of mobile phones, camera and other electronic devices are strictly restricted inside the college / clinical areas during the working hours. Any violation on this will warrant ceasure of the equipment. The electronic gadgets will be permitted for online classes.
- Smoking and usage of tobacco in any form is strictly prohibited in the College premise, hostel and bus etc.
- The students are expected to report their concerns to their Coordinators and Principal. Never a stranger or outsider should be involved to solve the academic related concerns of the students.
- A record of performance, leave, conduct and disciplinary actions will be maintained in the college and will be used for the future reference.
- Management will not be responsible for the loss of any valuable things belonging to students.
- Students should refrain from defacing and damaging the College property. In case of breakage/loss of the hospital or College property, they shall be responsible individually or collectively.

Misconduct

Students are liable for dismissal for misconduct, inefficiency or neglect of duty, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Institution, which are read and accepted by them. The management, following due enquiry, has the right to expel any student whose conduct and character are not satisfactory.

Without prejudice to general meaning of the word misconduct and without being exhaustive, the following will amount to acts of misconduct;

- Absence without permission from place/places of work during working hours.
- Improper and arrogant behaviors.
- Careless work / habitual negligence of work.
- Neglect of duty
- Habitual absence without leave or permission
- Use of inappropriate or abusive language.
- Involving in ragging / in disciplinary activities / smoking tobacco.

- Teasing and intimidating juniors, seniors, colleagues and staff members.
- Disrespecting the staff.
- Unauthorized use of mobile phones, camera etc

Penalties

- Caution or censure
- Warning / Memo /Show cause notice
- Suspension
- Dismissal / Termination from the course

Library

- There are mandatory prescribed library hours. The students are expected to utilize the time effectively.
- Students are allowed to borrow only two books at a time and retain them for a period of two weeks.
- If the borrowed books are not returned to the library on the due date a fine of Rs.10 per day will be imposed.
- Borrowers are required to examine the books at the time of borrowing and report to the librarian any damage, loss of pages, pictures etc noticed.
- Borrowers are not permitted to pass on the books to others. Book should be kept neatly. Avoid marking, underlining or defacing the books.
- Reference book should not be taken out of the library.
- If any book in your name is lost or damaged from the library the cost for replacement or for the rectification of the same shall be borne by the student.

Dress Code

- The students should wear prescribed uniform for college and clinical sessions.
- The uniform must be decent, clean well pressed and complete at all times.
- Students shall wear their Identity Card when they are inside the campus.
- Students in untidy dress, unkempt hair, improper and dirty socks, footwear etc will be denied admission to class.

Male candidate

- Shirt should be buttoned fully and inserted
- Daily shaving is must and hair should be properly cut.
- Prescribed uniform with black shoes.

Female candidate

- Minimal use of ornaments.
- Prescribed uniform with black shoes

Clinical Uniform

- Students attending clinical duty shall wear the prescribed uniform.
- Female students should put-up their hair while they are in clinics.
- Students can be in decent mufti dresses on Saturdays.

Health

- An individual comprehensive health record is maintained.
- A routine annual medical checkup will be conducted. Monthly weight is monitored.
- A record of vaccination is maintained. The candidate should submit the vaccination report as directed from time to time. Three doses of Hepatitis and TT vaccine will be included in the initial medical checkup.
- Students suffering from chronic diseases /contagious or infectious diseases should be taken precautions and such illness should be reported to the class coordinator.

Use of Electronic gadgets

The use of Mobile phone is strictly restricted inside the campus, hospital / college bus. However there is no permission for the use of electronic gadgets during class and clinical sessions, unless authorized. The violation will warrant seizure of the instrument and disciplinary action.

Communication

They shall use English as common language for communication.

Mentor / Counseling System

Student should undergo individual / group counseling once in a month. An external counseling facility is available.

College Union Election

The college Union election will be conducted once in a year as prescribed by the University. The college will not entertain any kind of unhealthy works / disputes related to Union election works.

Online Session

The candidate should possess appropriate personal gadget (Android Mobile phone / laptop/ tablet/ Note pad) for the smooth conduction of online classes incase indicated.

Anti Ragging Measures and declaration

- Ragging is strictly prohibited inside the college/ Hostel /Hospital campus and Bus.
- The anti-ragging committee, Anti ragging monitoring cell and Anti ragging squad are functioning in the College headed by Principal.

- Each student and their guardian should sign a declaration regarding the rules and regulation of Anti ragging act.
- Informative classes on anti ragging act will be conducted by legal authority and faculty members at the time of admission.
- The students should report any incidence of ragging (Preferably written document in mother tongue) immediately to the concerned authority.

Circulars /Protocols

- The students are obliged to follow all the orders, circulars and protocols issued by the KUHS / Government authority/ Principal/ Management of the institution from time to time.
- The students are instructed to follow the protocols issued by the authority from time to time on special circumstance (COVID 19 preventive measures)

Hostel rules

- Strictly follow the rules and regulations regarding discipline, conduct, outing, visiting hours, mess and study hours as prescribed by the college/hostel authorities
- Mark your presence during the roll call and sign the register daily.
- The students are not permitted to leave the hostel without the prior permission of Coordinator/Vice Principal/Principal/Warden. Apply in the prescribed hostel leave format in advance stating the reason of leaving and the address of destination with the phone number. If the student happens to leave the hostel without permission it will be reported to my parents immediately.
- If the student happen to extend her stay at home beyond the leave period permitted, due to health or any other most essential reason, she should bring proper permission letter from her parents.
- The student should not stay in the hostel during class hours without the permission of Class Coordinator.
- The student should produce identity cards on demand, for verification of identity by any authority of this College /Hostel.
- The student should not use mobile phone/Laptops without permission of authority.
- The student should dine in the hostel mess only. She should not enter inside the kitchen without permission.
- No parent or guardian of the student is permitted to stay in the Hostel.
- Visitors are not entertained to the hostel without permission.
- Switch off the fans and lights whenever you leave the room.
- Always keep my room neat and tidy.

- Participate in all the meetings and functions officially arranged by the authorities.
 The student should not organize meetings of any kind without the prior permission of the Warden.
- The student should not involve in playing cards, smoking, consuming drugs or alcohol. She should not possess obscene pictures, posters, lethal weapons, or any inflammation materials inside the hostel.
- TV channels / programs shall be watched according to the rules.
- The student should not involve in arguments or otherwise interfere with the duties of the employees of the hostel. If there is any complaint or suggestion to be made then you have to approach the warden.
- Never take law into your own hands. If the student found to involve in any undesirable activities or causing inconveniences or physical injury to any inmate or staff on any circumstances, then suitable disciplinary actions may be taken.
- Do not play with water, color water, color powder, eggs etc for any sort of celebration within the hostel premises.
- Do not possess or light/ burst firecrackers inside the hostel premises without permission.
- The student is responsible for any damage to electrical gadgets or loss of furniture and personally and collectively responsible for any loss, damage to the buildings, furniture, apparatus or other property of the hostel. The loss caused if any, shall be recovered as per the norms of the college.
- Do not indulge in any behavior or act that may be constituted as ragging inside the hostel campus according to Supreme Court law. According to the law stated the student is liable for punishment if she is found guilty of ragging. She should be responsible to report the incidence of any form of ragging to the authority.
- Pay my mess fees on or before 5th of every month. 6 months rent advance to be paid at the time of admission to the hostel. The amount is non refundable on discontinuation of hostel stay.
- I am aware that once vacated from the hostel, the readmission is denied.
